CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK

The Catholic Schools throughout our nation are celebrating "Catholic Schools Week." Each year has a theme. This year it is Faith, Academics, Service. The two Catholic schools in our diocese nearest to us are St. Michael's in Netcong and St. Joseph's in Mendham. They each in their own ways help to enhance the elements of the theme in their students each day. The three Long Valley Parishes - OLM, St. Luke's and St. Mark's are part of the coalition of ten parishes that help support St. Michael's. The pastors all share in the responsibility for this school as it continues to fulfill its goal of teaching the faith and educating a younger generation of Catholics.

I want to expand the theme to all of us, no matter how old we are. Our religious education programs (CEC/CCD or whatever name we call them) are geared to passing on the faith to our young people and letting them experience that service to others is one of the fundamental keystones of our faith.

For all of us as Catholics, regardless of our age, our personal faith in God is so important to a sense of well being in our life. This is one of the reasons we come to church each week - to celebrate the common gift of faith that we share in Jesus Christ and to be challenged to take that gift and put it into action in the world.

Our personal relationship with Jesus Christ should be the source for all that we do in service to others. Part of being of service to others is that we recognize their needs. I believe that we as adult Catholics have an obligation to become more educated in the teachings of the church in regard to many social issues that face us in our time. With the internet today there is much available to help us learn. For starters, you can go to the Vatican web site www.vatican.va and our national bishops' website www.usccb.org to find documents and policy teachings on many issues. I would hope in future articles to highlight some of the issues we study and have a truly Catholic approach to the needs of others. *Father Joe*

READINGS FOR THE WEEK



FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Deuteronomy 18:15-20

Moses explains to the people that a prophet will come from among them, and that they should listen to this prophet's words, for God has told him of this prophet. God also tells Moses that anyone who pretends to speak in his words, or speaks in the name of other gods shall die.

Second Reading: I Corinthians 7:32-35

Paul tells the Corinthians how an unmarried man or woman is able to devote themselves fully to God without concern for the needs of a spouse. Paul explains that God wants to help them promote good and devote themselves more fully to God.

Gospel: Mark 1:21-28

As Jesus was teaching, a man with an unclean spirit came to the synagogue and asked if Jesus had come to destroy them. Jesus ordered the spirit out of the man, who shrieked violently as the spirit departed. The people were amazed at the authority he had over the spirit.
